MA	III	<b>PO-C7 Modern Political Thought</b>	Political Science	<p>CO1: The purpose of this course is to introduce to the student political ideas, views and concerns of leading Indian thinkers.</p> <p>CO2: The course encourages students to understand and decipher the diverse and often contesting ways in which the ideas of nationalism, democracy and social transformation were discussed in pre and post-independence India.</p>
MA	III	<b>PO-C8: Political Sociology</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : This Course will introduce the overall scope of the sub-discipline of political sociology.</p> <p>CO 2 : The focus of the course will be on the political sociology of power.</p> <p>CO 3 : The emphasis is on the nature of power in modern societies-more in the form of organizations and social formations than as individual power. Students are also expected to understand different forms of justifications of power and the role of ideology in this regard.</p> <p>CO 4 : State will be studied as a repository of power in society while class and patriarchy are two instances of how the nature of power is shaped by social factors.</p>
MA	III	<b>PO-C9 World Politics-New Developments</b> )	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : The objectives of this course are to introduce the students to the contemporary issues and debates in the world politics.</p> <p>CO 2 : The students would also be made aware of the dimensions of the making of the foreign policy as well as the role of Non- State Actors in World Politics.</p> <p>CO 3 : They would also learn about the emerging New World Order and the challenges to it.</p>

MA	III	<b>PO-O10 Political Thought of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : This course aims at training the students to study one political thinker in depth.</p> <p>CO 2 : It also expects students to know the anti-caste thinking in Indian context.</p> <p>CO 3 : The course is also expected to relate the thinking of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar to contemporary problems.</p>
MA	IV	<b>PO-C10 Fundamentals of Political Theory</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : This course introduces the students to the evolution, importance to the study of Political Theory.</p> <p>CO 2 : It introduces Political Theory as a distinctive area of inquiry. It is the integral area to the study of politics. It highlights debates in the field and places them in a historical perspective.</p>
MA	IV	<b>PO-C11 Political Process in India</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : The course will introduce to the student the key issues and details of the political process in post independence India.</p> <p>CO 2: It will also try to develop among students a perspective to understand and analyse Indian politics.</p> <p>CO 3: The aim is to help students understand the expansive meaning of political process as it shapes in the arena of electoral and party politics, in the form of mass mobilizations and as politics of interests.</p>
MA	IV	<b>PO-C12 Politics and Society</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : This Course expects students to understand the interface of politics with social structures and processes and how the nature of power is shaped by social factors.</p>

MA	IV	<b>PO-O15 Election Studies</b>	Political Science	<p>CO 1 : This course has a dual purpose. It seeks to introduce to the students the methods of studying elections.</p> <p>CO 2 : It also seeks to acquaint the student with the practice of studying elections in India and issues involved in it.</p> <p>CO 3 : The course expects students to understand the different methods of election study.</p> <p>CO 4 : Taking off from the history and evolution of election studies, the course further dwells on key issues in India's electoral politics.</p>
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
